Scam Alerts!!!

Your Social Security number is an important key for an indentity thief. Scammers want it, and they think of all sorts of way to trick you into giving it away. Here is some tips on how to deal with government imposters:

- Don't give the caller your information. Never give out or confirm sensitive information - like your bank account, credit card, or Social Security number unless you know who you're dealing with. If someone has contacted you, you can't be sure who they are.
- Don't trust a name or number. Con artist use official sounding names to make you trust them. To make their call seem legitimate, scammers use internet technology to spoof their area code - so although it may seem they are calling from Washington, DC, they could be calling from anywhere in the world.
- Check with the Social Security Administration. The SSA has a warning about these scams and suggests you contact them directly at 1-800-772-1213 to verify the reason for the contact and the person's identity prior to providing any information to the caller.
